

Grade 2 Exemplars

Prompt: Octopuses need to protect themselves. Protect means to keep safe. Describe what octopuses can do to protect themselves. Support your answer with details from both texts.

Exemplar A:

An octopus protects itself. An octopus can squirt black ink. This darkens the water so it can hide behind the ink. Next, they can also move through small holes in coral reef structures. Bigger creatures cannot catch them because they would get stuck in these holes. Mimic octopuses can change colors and into terrifying shapes. This makes them look fierce so others will not go near to them. This is how an octopus protects itself.

Prompt: Octopuses need to protect themselves. Protect means to keep safe. Describe what octopuses can do to protect themselves. Support your answer with details from both texts.

Exemplar B:

An octopus protects itself in many ways. These creatures live in coral reef structures that have small holes. They can hide inside these small holes so no one will see them. Next, they can also squirt black ink if enemies attack them. This keeps them safe because the black ink makes it hard for predators to see them. Finally, an octopus can swim as fast as 25 mph to escape from enemies. Others cannot catch them because they are so strong and fast. This is how an octopus stays safe in the ocean.

Prompt: Octopuses need to protect themselves. Protect means to keep safe. Describe what octopuses can do to protect themselves. Support your answer with details from both texts.

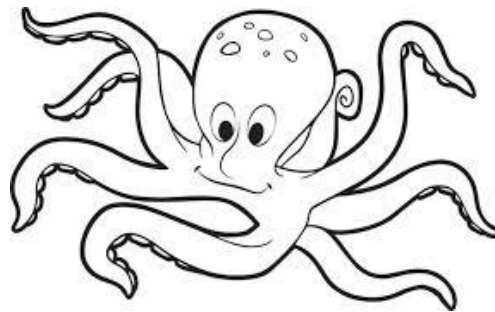
Exemplar C:

Finally, an octopus is a strong swimmer and can move fast if it is in danger. Octopuses are good at protecting themselves.
